

Action Steps for Home Instruction - C.R. 100.10

Who	Action	Time Frame
Notice of Intention to Instruct at Home		
Parent	Sends written notice to superintendent of intention to instruct child at home	By July 1 each year or within 14 days after commencing home instruction or moving into district
Procedures for Development and Review of an Individualized Home Instruction Plan (IHIP)		
School District	Sends to parent copy of C.R. 100.10 and a form for IHIP for each child	Within 10 business days after receiving notice from parent
Parent	Submits completed IHIP to school district (The district shall provide assistance in preparation of the forms, if requested by the parents)	By August 15 each year or within 4 weeks of receipt of C.R. 100.10 and IHIP form, whichever is later
School District	Notifies parents of IHIP compliance or gives written notice of any deficiencies	By August 31 each year or within 10 business days of receipt of IHIP, whichever is later
Parent	If necessary, submits a revised IHIP to school district which corrects any deficiencies	Within 15 days of receipt of notice of deficiency in IHIP or September 15 , whichever is later
Superintendent	If necessary, reviews revised IHIP and notifies parents of its compliance or gives written notice of the reasons the IHIP was determined not to be in compliance and the date of the next regularly scheduled Board of Education (BOE) meeting to be held at least 10 days after the mailing date of notice	By September 30 each year or within 15 days of receipt of the revised IHIP, whichever is later
Parent	If necessary, notifies the BOE of desire to contest the superintendent's determination of IHIP noncompliance	At least 3 business days prior to BOE meeting date
Parent	If necessary, presents proof of compliance of IHIP to the BOE	At the regularly scheduled BOE meeting at least 10 days from mailing date of the superintendent's notice of IHIP noncompliance
BOE	If necessary, makes a final determination of the compliance or non-compliance	At the regularly scheduled BOE meeting at which the parent presents proof of compliance of their IHIP
Parent	If necessary, may appeal a final determination by the school district of IHIP noncompliance to the Commissioner of Education	Within 30 days following receipt of determination of noncompliance of the IHIP
Parent	If necessary, provides for the instruction of their children at a public school or elsewhere if and when no appeal is available concerning noncompliance of the IHIP	Immediately

Required Courses:**Grades 1-6**

Math, Reading, Spelling, Writing, the English Language, Geography, U.S. History, Science, Health, Music, Visual Arts, PE, bilingual education and/or English as a new language where the need is indicated.

Grades 7-8

English - 2 units; History/Geography - 2 units; Science - 2 units; Math - 2 units; Physical Education - regularly; Art - 1/2 unit; Music - 1/2 unit; health - regularly; practical arts - regularly; library skills - regularly. The units are cumulative requirements for grades 7-8.

**Required once during Grades 1-8: U.S. History; N.Y.S. History; Constitution of U.S and N.Y.S.

Grades 9-12

English - 4 units; Social Studies - 4 units, which includes 1 unit of American History, 1/2 unit of government, 1/2 unit economics, mathematics 2 units, science 2 units, art and/or music 1 unit, health 1/2 unit, PE 2 units, 3 units of electives. The units are cumulative for grades 9-12.

** Required subjects to be covered during K-12: patriotism & citizenship; health education regarding alcohol, drug and tobacco misuse; highway, traffic and bicycle safety; fire and arson prevention and safety

(As per state law, a unit is equal to 6,480 minutes of instruction per year)

Children	Attend upon instruction	The substantial equivalent of 180 days and 900 hours per year for grades 1-6, and 180 days and 990 hours per year for grades 7-12
Parent	Maintains records of attendance (permitting absences on the same bases as the district uses for its own students)	180 days per year or the equivalent
School District	May review records of attendance	Upon request
Quarterly Reports		
Parent	Submits to the school district Quarterly Report for each child containing the following: (1) number of hours of instruction during quarter; (2) description of material covered in each subject listed in the IHIP; (3) grade in each subject or a written evaluation of child's progress; and (4) a written explanation of less than 80% of the course material listed in the IHIP for any subject is covered	On or before dates specified in IHIP or Quarterly Reports

Parent	Submits annual assessment along with the fourth Quarterly Report. Determines if the annual assessment will include (1) commercially published standardized test with current norms for student's age or (2) an alternative form of evaluation	Grades 1-8

School District	Notifies parents in writing of failure to comply with at least 75% of objective of a remediation plan each semester or 100% of objectives of the remediation plan within 2 years and notified them of the next regularly scheduled BOE meeting which will fall 10 days past the notice's mailing date and the parents' right to contest the determination	End of semester or after two years probation
