# Be Aware - SAT related SCAM from NYS Education Dept:

Dear parent/guardian and students,

Please let this serve as a reminder that you should not share personal or financial information over the phone with unsolicited callers. If you receive such a call, hang up immediately. We are sending this reminder because parents and/or guardians of children who have recently taken an SAT or PSAT exam have been receiving scam calls requesting personal information, including a credit card number, to mail the test results.

Additional tips about how to protect yourself from SAT test-related scams can be found on the Better Business Bureau website and below:

- Always be wary of unsolicited callers: If you receive a random call from someone asking for payment, research their organization before sharing any personal information.
- Double check with your child: If someone claims they're calling because of a service your child requested, hang up and check with your child first.
- Understand the College Board's practices: The College Board will never ask you for your bank or credit card information over the phone or through email.
- Don't give your financial information to strangers: Never agree to pay a stranger with any form of payment for a purchase you didn't initiate.

# STUDENTS: do you want to check out a CTE PROGRAM?



In order to be eligible for these programs, students must meet the following criteria:

- Visit the program via the school field trip (Jan 27) or the CTE Open House (March 6, 5:30-7:30 pm \*you can visit as many programs as you want at the Open House)
- Be passing all classes by the end of 3rd quarter and be on target to be a junior (or senior) next year. CTE gives next year's juniors preference over seniors for program spots.
- Have good attendance miss no more than 5% (7 days) of school through Q3
- · Have minimal disciplinary infractions from now on

#### FIELD TRIP - LIMITED SPOTS!

Monday, January 27, 2025, 11 am - 2 pm

CTE allows only 5 students to visit each class during the field trip, with a 50 student total cap! First come, first served.

Permission Slips are available in the Counseling & Career Center **starting Dec 20 and are due no later than Wednesday, January 15**, 2025 but many *programs will fill up before* that date – get yours in ASAP

# OPEN HOUSE - ALL WELCOME!

Thursday, March 6, 2025, 5:30-7:30pm

Parents and students can see as many programs as they would like during Open House.

There will likely be a bus that night. Get the permission slip for this in the Counseling & Career Center (C&CC) and return it by Friday, February 28.

After your visit, if you have decided you would like to request to attend a CTE program, pick up a contract from the C&CC and return it ASAP. Failure to do so may hurt your chances of attending and could dictate who goes on the waitlists, when needed.

- If selected, you commit to attending the program for the entire year.
- CTE programs are worth a total of 3 or 4 credits per year and most include an integrated technical math or science credit in the first year, depending on the program.
- Opportunities to earn certification, licensure and/or college credits available in some programs
